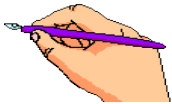

I was delighted by all the different scenery that Thomas had in his gallery. All of his pieces "light up" as soon as I looked at the many different types of houses, cabins, cottages and main streetlights I saw. So I thought it would be nice to do a little research on Kinkade's work.

Thomas Kinkade was born January 18, 1958 in Sacramento, California and grew up in a small village of Placeville, California. After graduation in 1976, Thomas went to the University of California, Berkeley and the Art Center College of Design in Pasadena. In 1982, he married his childhood sweetheart Nanette and they brought up four daughters. He is well known as a "Painter of Light". He uses glowing highlights and saturated pastel colors. His paintings contain various Christian themes and many pictures have a specific chapter-and-verse with certain Bible passages. Thomas also hides the letter "N" in his paintings as a tribute to his wife who passed away. He also did a semi-autobiographical movie called the "Christmas Cottage" that you just got to see.
