

AUTISM

Autism Services A variety of services designed to assist individuals with autism and their families in meeting the unique challenges they face.

Autism-Based Classrooms Integrated preschool opportunities designed to meet the intensive, individual needs of children with a diagnosis of autism spectrum disorder. In conjunction with related services, the classroom offers intervention strategies including positive behavior support, discrete trial teaching, social skill development, picture exchange communication system, and visual strategies.

Autism Diagnostic & Evaluation Clinic Evaluations are provided for children suspected of having a developmental disability. Licensed psychologists/physicians provide individuals with comprehensive diagnosis and treatment options while minimizing needless travel.

Autism Respite Training Offered to respite workers, family care providers, parents, and other individuals wanting to learn more about autism. All training is free and open to the public.

RESIDENTIAL

Community Apartments A safe, cost-effective environment for individuals with and without disabilities. Apartments include a community room, kitchen, laundry facilities, office space, and easy access to public transportation.

Transitional Apartments Eight apartments designed to assist with transition from the parents' home, certified setting, or nursing home to independent living based on each individual's needs.

Individualized Residential Alternative Provides a certified living opportunity for children and adolescents in Gorham. The young adults work on individual goals in a home setting which ensures their health and safety while encouraging growth toward independence.

CHILDREN'S SERVICES

Integrated Preschool Our New Friends Preschool, certified by the New York State Education Department, integrates children with and without disabilities in a caring and accepting environment where each child's strengths are emphasized.

Early Intervention Program A variety of services are offered for children ages birth to three, including individual therapy and education services, and developmental toddler groups at each of our centers.

Developmental Evaluations Happiness House is an approved evaluation site for children ages birth to five with a questionable or known developmental delay.

Child Care Licensed by the Office of Children and Family Services, this inclusive, wrap around, child care program is open to children ages three to five.

Universal Pre-Kindergarten (UPK) Available in Canandaigua, Geneva, Midlakes (Phelps-Clifton Springs), and Waterloo, this program provides preschool opportunities for four-year-old children.

Special Education Itinerant Teacher Program SEIT supports are provided on a limited basis to eligible preschoolers in day care, preschool programs, or at home.

Related Services Eligible preschoolers can receive occupational, physical, and speech therapy services at one of our approved agency sites or community-based providers.

Summer Recreation Program A full-day, four-week summer program designed to meet the needs of children ages five through 21 who have physical disabilities or developmental delays. Transportation is provided.

TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY/NURSING HOME TRANSITION AND DIVERSION WAIVER SERVICES

Service Coordination The service coordinator acts as a liaison and advocate for the individual receiving services to develop and implement a program to meet their specific needs.

Independent Living Skills Training (ILST) ILSTs assist individuals in the home or community to develop a plan of service that meets their specific needs, including employment, transportation, social opportunities, fiscal independence, health and well-being, education, and maintaining a home.

Structured Day Program (SDP) This adult learning environment provides individualized supports in a group setting. Participants have the opportunity to develop meaningful friendships with other individuals who are working on their recovery. Individuals may select pre-vocation, technology, recreation, photography, fitness, cognitive rehabilitation, and project-based learning opportunities.

Community Integration Counseling (CIC) Assists the individual to cope with the stress, grief, frustration, and sense of loss that can accompany a brain injury. When appropriate, family members may also receive counseling.

Home & Community Support Services (HCSS) Assists individuals with the every day tasks necessary to live successfully and safely (may include licensed home care). Support for activities of daily living, companionship, and accessing the community (shopping and entertainment).

Positive Behavioral Interventions and Support Services Qualified behavior specialists work with individuals who have behavioral challenges jeopardizing their ability to remain in the community. Services are designed to decrease target behaviors and teach more appropriate behaviors.

OPWDD SERVICES

Community Habilitation Assists individuals with developmental disabilities to improve or maintain their ability to live independently. This service focuses on the individual's needs and interests and is provided on a one-to-one basis in the individual's residence and in the community.

Respite Provides short-term relief for caregivers of individuals with a developmental disability. Respite is offered in the individual's residence as well as in groups.

Day Habilitation Integrates adults who have sustained a traumatic brain injury and focuses on cognitive habilitation and independent living skills in a non-traditional day-service setting.

Family Partnership Program Allows families to receive funding for items or services provided to an individual with a developmental disability. These funds help to offset the cost of adaptive equipment, learning tools, or the enhanced rate of sitter services.

Fiscal Intermediary Provides administrative and billing support to individuals who choose to self-direct their services. We are the employer of record for self-hired staff, and we pay for and track expenditures authorized in the individual's budget.

Broker Services Assists individuals who self-direct their services to navigate the budget process and create a package supporting their goals and needs to ensure individuals have as much control and choice as possible.

Home Services Sponsored by the New York State Elks, this program enables Happiness House to provide individuals assistance with referrals to meet their specific needs.

Children's Waiver Comprehensive Care Management Care Managers work with youth, their families, and providers to help the individual receive the care and services they need to stay healthy. We serve children under the age of 21, who currently have or can qualify for Medicaid and have a chronic health, medical and/or mental health condition which requires a doctor's care.

Article 16

Specialized services to meet the needs of individuals with a developmental disability. Highly-trained staff offer one-to-one speech, occupational, physical, and psychology therapy.

CLINICAL SERVICES

Article 28

Specialized services for individuals diagnosed with a brain injury, stroke, or other qualifying disability. Our staff offer one-to-one, speech, occupational, physical therapy, psychology, and psychiatry services.
